What is Rotary?

Rotary is an international, secular, non-political organization open to all persons regardless of race, color, creed, gender, profession, or political affiliation.

The traditional mottos of Rotary are Service above self and They profit most who serve best. There are more than 32,000 local Rotary clubs worldwide, with over 1.2 million members.

The Rotary Club of Belmont helps in local service projects, such raising money for the Salvation Army, the Belmont Food Pantry, and college scholarships for Belmont high school students, as well as international or global projects, such as raising money and providing tents for victims of the 2010 earthquake in Haiti, providing a bus for a school in Kenya.

The Four-Way Test

The four-way test guides Rotarians in what they think, say, and do in their personal and professional relationships:

1. Is it the **truth**?
2. Is it **fair** to all concerned?
3. Will it build **goodwill** and **better friendships**?
4. Will it be **beneficial** to all concerned?
